- 7. New Projects
 - a. Green Space Done,
 - b. Multi Court- Done,
 - c. Boat Launch pads were repositioned last Fall ice movement has shifting pads again – Council has Water Agency Permit to correct will be complete as soon as contractor can arrive. Mitchell Brothers are coming in to fix when they are available.
 - d. **Dewatering** should be complete in June: ordered more hosing and getting more sump pumps installed. Piping should arrive within next two weeks and be installed in June.

Other:

- e. Willow Street (Beardsworth): With more year round people the roadway is too tight to allow proper access for residents and services. Therefore, getting it surveyed and some bush clearing on the roadway will be required (minimal amount). Additionally Hamlet is ordering markers for power boxes so that in the winter, people can see them clearly.
- f. **Canada Day Celebrations:** Paige Kindopp will spearhead activities. Cindy Roy moved to allow a budget of \$300, Veronica Laye seconded
- g. Walkway: Public space on corner of Willow and Poplar (south side of 601) to be assessed to create a pathway or walkway for residents to access the sandy beach (Reg Beardsworth)
- h. **No wake signs:** there are still no signs up yet. Clint contacted a company and waiting for response. Any signage put up must be approved by Transport Canada.
- i. Algae: lots of algae appearing, a result of nutrients in the lake. Turtle Lake Watershed has been doing some research. Nutrients come from the bottom, settlements on the water, temperature, and other causes. The algae consumes the oxygen in the water affecting the fish. We need to minimize the number of nutrients going into the water.

- j. Lake Weeds If you remove the lake weeds and seaweed from the shoreline take it to the dump. The board will recruit some young people to help clean up the public beach areas.
- k. Property North of Willow and Poplar owned by Beardsworth:
 Family was asked to keep the area a green space/natural landscape.
 They'd like to put up a sign that recognizes the Beardsworth history.
 They do not need to get hamlet approval to put up a sign on their own property.
- I. Garbage: the tender goes out next week.
- m. **Dogs:** Dogs need to be leased and cleaned up after. Are Poop disposal garbage bins an option. Mike will donate two of them.
- n. **Speed bumps:** they are being put in over the next week. Additional Speed Bumps will need to be ordered.
- o. **Key fobs:** need to put in another order. Let Barry Nordell know if you need one. Each cabin gets one free, additional is \$50.
- p. Website: it needs to be updated. Our web manager has been unavailable so another person needs to take it over.
- q. Garbage bin lock change: it was asked to be changed as it was published in the RM newsletter. The cost of garbage has gone down. The board will monitor it to see if it is being abused by outside residents and cost goes up.
- r. **Recycling**: please take your cardboard, etc. to Livelong recycling or the garbage dump. Collapse and cut/fold the cardboard as it takes up a great deal of space.
- s. Marina: a request to set up a docking station or a marina in order to park a boat for an extended stay. Some conflict at other lakes setting up marinas as everyone has access to the lake. Possibly look at efficiency regarding one dock with multiple slots for boats. NOTE: You cannot tie your boat to a tree or something that has the rope crossing the beach it is illegal and presents a number of safety hazzards. The board is limited with what they can do and the liability of storms.

- t. **Multipurpose Court thank you**: Linda thanked the community for supporting the project. We have a surplus thanks to Arnolds Sand and Gravel and all other contributors!
- u. **Storage Area:** \$200 per year for a spot, let the RM know.
- v. Gravel: to be put in turn around near Neale's cabin (555 Beach Ave.)
